Kenneth Rivera-Robles is the current president and chairman of the board of the Puerto Rico Chamber of Commerce (PRCC). He has been a member of the PRCC Board of Directors for the past 4 years and was its treasurer during the fiscal year 2016-2017. Kenneth is also a Partner in the Tax Practice of FPV & Galindez LLC, one of the 10 biggest accounting firms in Puerto Rico. He has a BBA (in accounting and computer science) and a JD from the University of Puerto Rico.
