A Decade of Growth

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PR in 2000: Remember when...

- Seniors had no support to buy their medicine
- No support for dental care
- No help to buy eyewear
- Beneficiaries could not pay the Part A deductible for hospital stays
- There were no regional service centers to provide services and orientations about Medicare
- Almost 100,000 people paid close to \$1,000 a year for Medigap coverage – without medicines
- Seniors where seldom seen in Print Ads or TV
 - Much less seen having fun
- Seniors were alone...





The Economy

- Today MA & Part D bring over \$1.5 BILLION more yearly to PR, and approximately \$4 Billion in total funds to the health insurance market
- Medicare beneficiaries represent over 50% of the total healthcare consumption in PR
- On average, MA additional resources and Part D represent over \$3,000 in extra benefits per person every year
- Direct jobs in healthcare have increased more than 10,000 net
