Marina Diaz has designed and implemented healthcare systems for the last 21 years. Her contributions to mental health within the Puerto Rico Health Plan have been the integrated delivery system and adoption of a recovery culture. The commitment to enhancing mental health services on the island is her driving force. She is in charge of developing the primary care integration efforts.

Before joining FHCHS of Puerto Rico, Díaz was the Administrator of First Hospital Panamericano, facilitating post-opening implementation of the organization and assisting with the cultural implementation of a total quality approach. These efforts earned her a Joint Commission review "with commendation" in 1994. She successfully facilitated the hospital's evolution toward an integrated delivery system, while supervising the opening of four partial-hospitalization centers and two psychiatric units in medical surgical facilities. As Sub-Administrator of Mepsi Center Hospital, a psychiatric hospital, she was responsible for quality control and human resources. She was a patient advocate, a patient services coordinator and Assistant Director of Quality Services at Elmhurst Hospital in New York from 1985-1987.

Díaz earned a Masters Degree in health services administration from the Puerto Rico Graduate School of Public Health, Medical Sciences Campus, and a Bachelor Degree in Psychology with emphasis in social organization.
