## Data Sources in the Healthcare System

- Healthcare Providers
  - Facilities
    - Uncompensated Care
  - Physicians
    - Encounters and coding
  - Ancillary
    - Results and usage
- Health Plan
  - Required claims, encounter and quality reporting
- Government
  - Federal
  - Local
    - Medicaid indicators















## Quality Metrics for Puerto Rico MA Plans

Highly Rated MA-PDs continue to be available in the vast majority of regions across the country. <u>Puerto Rico stands out</u> for its concentration of MA-PD enrollees in highly rated contracts.
