

Dr. Mario Marazzi-Santiago is an accomplished executive, research economist and data scientist with a career spanning over two decades. In 2002, he started as an Economist in the Division of International Finance of the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System in Washington, DC, during which time he worked on the macroeconomic projections used by the Federal Reserve to make monetary policy decisions and published several articles in academic journals and two chapters on the topic of international economics. In 2007, he was appointed as the first Executive Director of the Puerto Rico Institute of Statistics, which he built from the ground up, including its research initiatives, its technical assistance programs, its training programs and its extensive collaboration with federal and international organizations. Subsequently, in 2023, he joined the Puerto Rico Judiciary as Director of the Office of Statistics, Data Sciences and Judicial Planning, where he assisted the Puerto Rico Appellate and Supreme Court improve the coverage of their reporting to the National Center for State Courts. Currently, he is spearheading the establishment of the first Federal Statistical Research Data Center outside the continental United States, based in the U.S. Census Bureau's office in Guaynabo. Dr. Marazzi-Santiago holds a bachelor's degree in economics from Harvard University, a master's degree in economics from the London School of Economics, and a Ph.D. in economics from Cornell University. In 2012, Dr. Marazzi was elected as the first Puerto Rican member of the International Statistical Institute.
