

Yussef Galib-Frangie Fiol, MD, FACP



Dr. Galib was born in San Juan, Puerto Rico and raised between the cities of San Juan and San Germán (mostly the latter). He graduated from St. John's High School and attended Brown University and University of Puerto Rico at Mayagüez where he received a B.S. in Animal Science with honors which garnered him an induction into Gamma Sigma Delta, The Honor Society of Agriculture. Dr. Galib practiced as an agronomist at the State's Department of Agriculture, and he presided over the Western Region Chapter of the Puerto Rico College of Agronomists. He received his MD from Ponce Health Sciences University (formerly known as Ponce School of Medicine) while also working as the Executive Director of the Youth Affairs and Western Region Development Commissions at the Puerto Rico Senate. He did his residency training in Internal Medicine at San German's de la Concepción Internal Medicine Residency

Program with additional post-graduate training in Pathology (Medical Sciences Campus of the University of Puerto Rico) and Radiology (Medical College of Georgia).

Dr. Galib is a Fellow of the American College of Physicians and a Diplomate of the American Board of Internal Medicine, and he is an Attending Physician at Hospital de la Concepción's Internal Medicine Residency Program as well as Assistant Professor of Medicine at Ponce Health Sciences University. Dr. Galib works as a full-time Hospitalist in both Hospital de la Concepción and Hospital Metropolitano San Germán and is Associate Inpatient Medical Director at inHealth of Puerto Rico, LLC.

Dr. Galib is currently the 90th President of the Puerto Rico Medical Association, President of the Puerto Rico Medical Hall of Fame Committee, Delegate from Puerto Rico to the House of Delegates of the American Medical Association, President of the Fundación Asistencia al Centro de Trauma de Puerto Rico, and Vice-President of the Fundación Antonio Fas Alzamora, among others.

He is involved in social and cultural organizations such as the Order of Malta (of which he is a Knight), the "Círculo de Recreo de San Germán" (Puerto Rico's oldest cultural institution) and the National Trust for Historic Preservation (his lifelong aim is restoring

his century-old home in San Germán). He is an avid shooting sportsman as well as a bassist in several local bands.

He is happily married to attorney María del Pilar Fas and they both are in the process of establishing a non-profit organization for the preservation of Puerto Rican history and architecture.
