## Annual Federal Allocations to PR Medicaid Program


- 2028 onwards, the federal amount allocated will be the 2019 allocation (\$2.65 B) increased by the urban health care component of each subsequent CPI year.
- In determining future allocations, the HHS Section may not consider the 2022 allotment provided through the novel interpretation of CMS statute.

## Additional Enhancements to Federal Appropriation

Fiscal year	Annual increase	Federal Status on PR Medicaid Program	
2023- 2027	\$300M	Establish a medical payment floor of 75% of the Medicare rate	
2023- 2025	\$75M	Establish Integrity Officer	
2026- 2027	\$75M	Establish an Integrity Officer and Procurement and Performance Oversight Lead	

- These increases are not taken into account in the reference financing when determining allotments for subsequent years.
- The 75% Medicare payment floor is an increase over 70% applicable 2020-2021




## Increase of CDT Payments

#### 100% MFS for CPT codes

- Increases overall CDT Current compensation from \$43M to \$53M.
- Compensation is based on Medicare Part B MFS-CPT codes
- Fiscal Impact: \$10.8 Million or \$16.84 per visit
  - \$8.2M at 76% Federal Share
  - **\$2.6M** at 24% State Fund





• Revenue depends on accurate and correct billing of services.



## Increase to 100% Federal Poverty Level

Financial projections submitted to FOMB and approval to budget granted on 11/5/23

CMS approval letter expected


Retroactive effect to July 1, 2023.

#### **Key Notes**

- ■FPL will retain 60,000-70,000 enrollees.
- It accounts for current program expenses, with no increases in current costs.
- No show beneficiaries must recertify with Medicaid before 12/1/23.





- Essential Benefits
- No waiting periods
- No underwriting or preexisting condition analysis for enrollment
- No yearly/lifetime limits
- No cost-sharing for preventive services

### Eligibility

- •100% 400% FPL Income
- Non-insured participants only (no employer plan)

### Subsidy

 Contribution by enrollee from 0% to 8.5%, income-based by household.
